CRITERION I – CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 - Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

Our College is affiliated to Punjabi University, Patiala and follows the curriculum prescribed by the University. Academic calendar for every session is prepared by the college in accordance with the schedule provided by the university. A lively plan for timely implementation is formulated by the institution to make sure effective delivery. To access the academic performance a committee formulated by the Principal for preparing policies after strategizing the simplest methods to successfully implement the curriculum. Various strategies are figured out after discussions with the members. The Prospectus mentions the semester specific courses and also the evaluation procedure for B.Ed., M.Ed., Certificate course in inclusive education and Post Graduate Diploma in Career Guidance programmes. Class wise schedule is drafted and finalized well before the commencement of semester. The papers/options are allotted after careful consideration of the qualification, subject specialization, experience and performance of the faculty members. Faculties are encouraged to organize a lively plan for his or her classroom teaching of the each semester even before the tutorial year commences. The preparation of such an idea helps with effective distribution of syllabus, clarity of curriculum and timely completion of the course. The teaching plans are prepared by the respective teachers. Classroom teaching is supplemented with seminars, workshops, special lectures, group discussions, Tutorials, Departmental Quiz, paper presentation by the scholars , projects, group assignments, term-papers, educational tours, field trips and industrial visits for effective delivery of curriculum, which are wiped out a planned manner. Continuous evaluation is maintained throughout the year by conducting tests after completion of syllabus. The minimum number of working days as stipulated by the university is adhered to each year. Continuous assessment and academic progress of scholars through internal tests is followed. All the laboratories are replenished per annum as per the need of the curriculum. Use of ICT based learning has been incorporated along with lecture method for communication with students to form the teaching learning process more learner-centric. Problem Solving method, experiential learning and participative learning also are used for effective curriculum delivery in the classrooms. College has its own Youtube channel, Instagram account and facebook account for assisting the students. College professors also create their personal Youtube as well as Telegram channels to upload their lectures at regular intervals. Students also send study material on Google classroom. Every type of information also shared by teachers in

Whatsapp Groups. College also organises interdisciplinary competitions, events or exhibitions at regular intervals. Record of the regular attendance, mark lists and progress of the scholars are maintained by the respective teachers. Proper attendance is ensured by giving timely SMS. The college encourages faculty members to attend Orientation/Refresher courses, workshops, capacity building programmes, seminars and conferences conducted by the affiliating and other Universities for acquiring necessary skills for effective delivery of the curriculum. More emphasis is given to employability and entrepreneurship skills because the motive is to form them self dependent. The students get themselves familiar with the fundamentals of those skills and that they use them in their local

1.4.2 – How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

Feedback Obtained

The institution have well-defined system of feedback. Representatives provides extensive feedback during the formal as well as informal meetings regarding the various aspects of curricular and co-curricular activities. The alumni association of the college organizes annual meetings during which the old students of the college suggest improvements within the functioning of the college. The principals of the practicing schools are also give their comments regarding the performance of the pupil teacher. Parents provide feedback within the informal meetings at the time of admissions, college functions and at the time of evaluation and farewell of the scholars. Regular staff meetings are administered during which the college provides feedback received from the scholars in their routine classes, informal meetings and tutorial groups regarding participation in various activities. Under the mentor group system practiced by the institution the scholars give their feedback to the mentor group responsible about the various aspects of curriculum, difficulty faced by them during a particular course work, the certain areas which should be a neighborhood of the present curriculum etc. At the top of the year, the scholars fill within the feedback performa as under: Student's feedback questionnaire regarding the entire programme. Student's feedback questionnaire regarding the teacher's performance within the curriculum transaction. The results obtained in final examinations are used as reflective indicators of the strengths and weaknesses of the courses and curricula. This feedback is discussed in faculty meetings, suggestions are invited and given due consideration. Issues are discussed in IQAC meetings. All the issues are shared in Board of Studies meeting and the curriculum revision workshops conducted by Punjabi University from time to time. In this session feedback from students reflected demands in improvement on various aspects primarily curriculum transaction, blended mode of teaching learning and also remedial teaching. These issues were discussed in IQAC and then plans of action prepared in staff meeting and finally implemented and are now being executed in the on going session.

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2.3.2 – Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

Mentoring system is provided in the college. Mentor groups are formed in which 10 to 15 students are assigned a mentor. At the beginning of the semester, a detailed interview is held with each mentee. During this interview, information about mentee is recorded in a proper way. Mentor period is mentioned in the regular time table. During the mentor period, all the mentee assemble at prescribed place and discuss the issues with mentor both at the group level and at individual level. Mentor class is a platform for students to share their experiences and discuss their problems. Mentors motivate students to develop positive attitude and to participate in curricular and co-curricular activities Mentors provide counseling to the students for their educational, personal, psychological, vocational and emotional problems. All the mentor incharges prepare a cummulative record profile of the students to keep a track of their development. College have a library enriched with study material and ICT lab to provide mentoring to the students at academic level. Morning assembly is a regular feature of the college and organized by each mentor group in a rotation. During morning assembly, all the students of the group participate and perform different activities that are helpful to develop their self confidence.

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2.5.2 - Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

College is affiliated to Punjabi University Patiala and follow the guidelines of Punjabi University for evaluation of both continuous internal evaluation systems as well as semester end exams. Most of the assignments based on field work and required experiential learning reports. There is a provision of continuous evaluation of the student's progress which is monitored by keeping the records of the performance of each student in the different activities conducted in college. There is internal evaluation in each of the paper which is based on Class attendance , Participation of the student in class discussion, Written assignments ,General behavior ,Seminar Performance, Preparation of practical files, online evaluation of assignments submitted by students, regular class tests, House examinations, Student Seminar, Group discussions, Power Point presentations, debate competition, dissertations, short- term field tours and report preparation, assignments etc. Oral presentations by students during the class periods, Students deliver a short lecture on the taught topic in the same class, subject to availability of time , Discussions on topics from the syllabus on which research may be initiated are welcomed. The internal assessment is based on the sessional work of the students. For project report a unique practice of pre viva for students is conducted before the final vivavoce examination. Students are also encouraged to present papers in conferences, papers and seminars or have publications in peer reviewed journals During the assessment, weakness of the students are identified and on the basis of this report, remedial teaching provided to the students.

2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

College follows the guidelines of Punjabi University Patiala. Academic calendar for the new session prepared by the University every year. By consulting the University calendar, the Principal along with the IQAC and coordinators of different committees prepares the academic calendar. During the preparation of Academic calendar, all the curricular and co-curricular activities are considered. All the information regarding university notices and circulars related to the examinations convey to the students from time to time through student notice boards, college website, mentor groups, whatsaapp groups and also verbally by the faculty members of the college. In the college academic calendar a schedule of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for its students are prepared. Scheduled information of the Intra semester assessments and the final semester end exam for both the odd and even semesters are mentioned. All subject incharges conduct internal assessment of students and students are well informed about these internal examinations well in advance. Internal assessment dates are also provided by the college in the proposed

academic calendar prepared at the beginning of each academic session, which is uploaded on the college website Academic calendar is prepared well in advance to show the direction to the pupil teachers of assignments to be accomplished during each semester.

Different committees have been constituted for the maintenance and optimum utilization of physical, academic and support facilities. There is common support system for all types of maintenance in Akal Group of Institutions. College writes about any type of repair or maintenance to secretary of Akal College Council. All type of support system is provided from that common

platform. The classrooms are well equipped. LCD projectors are used for lectures. College building is used for competitive exams organized by government time to time. Ramp is made for differently abled students. Various laboratories are utilized as per curriculum of the respective courses and these are updated from time to time as per university recommendations. Library is housed in a big building having an area of 1217.76 square meters. It houses nearly 50,000 volumes along with a seating capacity of about 250 readers. One reading hall is enriched with journals, periodicals and newspapers. The library is open only for college students. It is regularly updated as per the needs of students and recommendations of the library committee. For athletic meet or sports activities common grounds are used by students of the college. As the lab computers are shared assets, the students may unknowingly expose the lab computers (and ultimately the institution) to security threats, viruses, malware, and more. Therefore, the IT cell of the college is well-equipped to tackle such challenges and to provide consistent computing environment to the stakeholders. Regular checks against these kinds of threats are performed and the computers are kept well up-to-date. The college main hall is regularly used for academic functions, National and International conferences/Seminar/Workshops, Cultural Programmes, festival celebrations, stage rehearsals, interactive sessions with eminent educationists, the elections/election rehearsals, and the awareness campaigns by the state and government departments and the sister institutions of the college. Committee of staff from teaching and non-teaching have been assigned duties to observe building time to time. They bring in notice if any type of repair or maintenance is needed. Library improvement cell works for improvement in library. On the recommendations of cell, new books, educational journals are added time to time. There is facility of book bank in library.
